Housing Expenses Checklist

Home Expenses:

- Mortgage or rent payments in full, encompassing principal, interest, escrow, and fees.
- Home equity loans or lines of credit, to the extent used for housing purposes.
- Appraisals, closing costs, title insurance, points paid on mortgage or refinance.
- Homeowners or renters' insurance, including personal umbrella insurance.
- Real estate or property taxes related to housing.
- Homeowners or condo association fees.
- Home assessments or related fees.

Maintenance:

- Cleaning supplies such as brooms, mops, vacuum cleaners, Swiffer's, steam cleaners, and spot cleaners.
- Various cleaning agents including floor cleaners, surface cleaners, and window cleaners.
- Dish and dishwasher detergent, sponges, and scrubbers.
- Laundry essentials like supplies, hampers, baskets, detergent, and dryer sheets.
- Landscaping and flower gardening expenses which include plants, seeds, and tools.
- Professional lawn care, landscaping, gutter cleaning, and winter snow removal services.

Repairs:

- Tools, miscellaneous hardware, and supplies.
- Batteries and light bulbs.
- Interior and exterior painting, along with painting supplies.
- Replacement costs for flooring, drywall, windows, screens, siding, and roof.

Furnishings & Appliances:

- Furniture, artwork, carpets, and rugs
- Decorative items for walls and shelves.
- Electronics such as TVs, entertainment media players, computers, printers, and related supplies.
- Appliances which include refrigerator, stove, microwave, slow cooker, dishwasher, washer/dryer, portable AC, and heaters.
- Kitchenware, pots, pans, baking sheets, and cooking implements.

- Dishes, glassware, table settings, and silverware.
- Window coverings, curtains, and wall coverings.
- Linens for dining room, bathroom, and bedroom including towels, sheets, blankets, and comforters.

Utilities:

- Electricity, natural gas, heating oil, propane, kerosene, water, sewer, trash, pest control, and firewood costs, including delivery or hauling charges.
- Subscription services such as cable or satellite TV, streaming services, and internet.
- Landline phone bills and costs associated with purchasing or leasing landline telephone equipment.

Items NOT allowed for Housing Allowance

- Groceries
- Paper products
- Personal Toiletries
- Personal Clothing
- Maid Services
- · Vegetable Seeds for a garden
- Cell Phone Service

Calculating the Housing Exclusion: The housing exclusion amount, which is excluded from federal income tax but not from federal self-employment income, is determined by the smallest of the following three amounts:

- 1. The amount properly designated in writing as the housing exclusion before payments to clergy/rostered workers commence.
- 2. The amount actually spent to provide housing during the calendar year.
- 3. The Fair Rental Value (FRV) of the home, including furnishings, utilities, etc.
